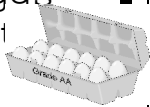

Lorette and Landmark Bylaw Enforcement



The bylaw enforcement officer is now on active duty in both Lorette and Landmark. In the first week of operation he found many very serious infractions - infractions that could cause serious injury, even death, to innocent people.

- > 21 summonses & 11 warnings were issued for speeding.
- > Of the 32 people stopped for speeding the average speed through the 50 km zone was 76.2
- > Summonses were issued for open liquor in the car and for open liquor in a public place.

Solving Problems Together
