Feed the Birds

High-protein bird treats:

4 cups suet or solid kitchen fat	¼ cup millet
1 cup cracker or break crumbs	¼ cup dried
fruit: raisins, etc	
½ cup sunflower seeds	¼ cup peanuts or peanut butter



Melt suet in a large, heavy saucepan. Remove from heat and allow to cool until slightly thickened. In a separate bowl, combine remaining ingredients. Pour cooled suet over the mixture and stir thoroughly. While the mixture is still warm and pliable, you can either spread it onto tree trunks or tree limbs for easy feeding; pack it into the spaces in pine cones and hang the cone on a nearby tree; or spread it in a 2.5 centimetre deep baking pan or several cake pans and refrigerate overnight. When the suet is completely hardened, cut it into squares to fit your feeder.
