Carbon Monoxide Alarm

You (CO)

have installed a carbon monoxide alarm in your home or business according to the manufacturer’s instructions. Great! Now let it do its

job and when you hear it beep, leap into action!

A beeping CO alarm means that deadly carbon monoxide gas is present. Even if you feel no symptoms of CO poisoning – and you won’t detect CO gas because it is colourless, odourless and tasteless – you must heed your alarm’s warning.

Open all doors and windows; evacuate everyone from the house immediately. From a neighbour’s phone or your cell call Manitoba Hydro at 1-800-465-3816 for an emergency inspection.

Your alarm is telling you something. Never unplug it or remove its batteries. You could save some lives, including your own.
